

### Who we are

Fraser Coast Career Pathways Program (FCCPP) supports students in taking the next step from school into a career or further study.

At the heart of FCCPP is the understanding that everyone's journey is different. The program supports students to explore the many career and study pathways available locally, while guiding them on how to position themselves for success once they leave school.

FCCPP works with students in years' 9-12 from 14 secondary schools in the Fraser Coast region.







#### Overview

FCCPP supports career education in schools and provides a vital link with local employers in the manufacturing, construction, engineering, and health sectors. We provide practical information and real-world experiences to students to enable them to make informed career or study pathway decisions.

FCCPP is funded by the Queensland Government, and managed and delivered by Regional Development Australia Wide Bay Burnett. The initiative has successfully achieved student outcomes in the Fraser Coast, so much that RDAWBB has won a second contract to deliver the program in Gympie region.

The program also delivers a range of activities including:



#### Industry immersion tours and workshops....

Giving real world insights into career pathways in the manufacturing, construction, engineering and health sectors.

#### Work experience opportunities....

Facilitating and coordinating opportunities between employers and schools.

## Vocational Education and Training in School (VETiS)....

Advising students and families during Senior education and Training (SET) planning.

linking local employment opportunities with students.

## Contemporary industry and employment advice....



#### Regional Stakeholders

With the support of regional stakeholders, FCCPP has earned a reputation for delivering tangible school to work transition outcomes. The program has become a valuable career education resource to the region's secondary schools.

Central to FCCPP's success is the commitment of regional industry employers to engage with schools through the program. Through FCCPP's networks, students have gained direct access to local employers who have generously opened their workplaces for immersive tours, work experience, and schoolbased apprenticeship and traineeship opportunities. Importantly, these employers have also shared their expertise, offering guidance on how to pursue careers in the manufacturing, construction, engineering, and health sectors, while also highlighting the breadth of employment opportunities available locally.



#### Benefits and Value to the Region

During the 2024 school year, FCCPP achieved the following outcomes:

Students participated in FCCPP.

Work experience and industry immersion placements.

Students benefited from career education support.

51

Students (and their parents/guardians) were supported to secure school-based apprenticeships/ traineeships.

Subject selection evenings were attended by FCCPP to support parents and students. 10

FCCPP exhibitions at regional career education events (jobs and careers expos, Youth Week, industry roadshows).







#### **Key Learnings**

Involving school students in the program's creative identity and branding was crucial to engaging them from the outset. The creative brand that brings FCCPP to life was designed by secondary students through a series of workshops facilitated by LeeLee West, a Fraser Coast artist who specialises in co-designing brands for programs with social impact.







Unfortunately, funding for FCCPP has not been continued as the School to Work Transition Program is a one-off Queensland Government initiative.

FCCPP is a locally driven solution to address regional skills gaps and promote youth employment. Funding arrangements for the program could be reviewed by Government, to enable continued investment into a program that has demonstrated with significant social and economic impact.




#### **Key Recommendations**



FCCPP's model and program logic can be duplicated statewide, in areas with the greatest need, to support school to work transition of Queensland's students. Local engagement and activities can be tailored to meet the needs of each region in which the program is delivered.





#### **Replicating Success**

Building on the success of the Fraser Coast Career Pathways Program, Regional Development Australia Wide Bay Burnett has secured new funding to expand its impact. The recently launched Gympie Career Pathways Program follows the same proven framework, connecting young people with diverse career opportunities. With a bold vision and strategic planning, we aim to extend this program across the region, creating even more pathways to success.



#### **Program Resources**

Over the 18-month funding period (1 July 2023 – 31 December 2024) RDAWBB employed1 FTE project manager to implement the program.

Unfortunately, the funding for FCCPP has not been continued as the School to Work Transition Program is a one-off Queensland Government initiative.
